## **MEMORANDUM**

**Re:** Administrative Law Judge ruling in contested case regarding approved use of horizontally installed prefabricated permeable panel block systems (PPBPS) and

retraction of October 18, 2016 memorandum regarding permitting of horizontal PPBPS

T&J Panel, Inc. filed a contested case regarding permitting of horizontally installed PPBPS in the Office of Administrative Hearings in November of 2016 following release of the Department's October 18, 2016 memorandum determining that horizontal installation of the PPBPS was not allowed under 15A NCAC 18A .1956(3)(a)(ii). The contested case proceeding has concluded. The Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) ordered that: "...the horizontal installation of the Panel Block System is allowed under Rule .1956 and that the 50% space reduction afforded the 16-inch Panel Block System applies equally to horizontal or vertical orientations."

The ALJ directed the On-site Water Protection Branch to retract its October 18, 2016 memorandum, which the ALJ ruled was issued erroneously and not in accordance with law or rule, but in good faith and not arbitrarily or capriciously. In accordance with that directive, this memorandum supersedes the October 18, 2016 memorandum, which is hereby retracted.

Sites permitted for installation of horizontal or vertical PPBPS systems manufactured by T&J Panel must meet the provisions of 15A NCAC 18A .1956(3)(a)(ii)(A) through (E).
